### Ranking Best Health Care Systems in the World by Country

Government healthcare refers to government funding of healthcare services via direct payments to doctors, hospitals, and other providers. In the U.S. healthcare system, medical professionals are not employed by the government. Instead, they provide medical and health services privately and are reimbursed by the government for these services, in much the same way that insurance companies reimburse them.

### The Role of Governance in Healthcare Organizations ...

While socialized systems strictly integrate with the government, the government may or may not play a role in single-payer systems. A socialized system indicates that the government owns the buildings that provide care (e.g., hospitals, primary care clinics, urgent care facilities, etc.) as well as employs those who provide care (e.g., doctors, nurses, medical assistants, etc.).
