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Occupational Therapy Evaluation For Children

A: Your pediatrician or another health care professional may have referred you to a pediatric occupational therapist to evaluate your child's ability to perform activities of daily living (brushing hair and teeth, getting dressed, eating, etc.), play (interacting with other children and toys), coordination and overall motor skills (coloring, cutting and handwriting).

Occupational therapy Assessment for children- Pediatric occupational therapist evaluates children and their environment to gather information needed to make a decision about intervention planning.

Used for infants, toddlers and young children to identify needs, track growth and development, and determining 'next steps' (target objectives). A questionnaire that is completed by an infant's or toddler's primary caregiver in order to gather information about the child's sensory processing abilities.

Most Common - Occupational Therapy - Tests, Assessments ...

Not all practitioners will gather this information exactly the same way but the general components

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of an Occupational Therapy evaluation will include background and developmental information, interview with parents or caregivers, assessment and observations directly with the child, and finally a comprehensive report that summarizes information gathered and sets goals for therapy based on those results.
