According to American Bar Association Formal Opinion 90-357, the term "of counsel" is used to describe a "close, personal, continuous, and regular relationship" between the firm and counsel lawyer. Combining N.C. RPC 85 and ABA Formal Opinion 90-357, the ethical requirements for an "of counsel" relationship are: 1) the "of counsel" lawyer must be licensed in North Carolina; 2) there must be a close, personal association between the "of counsel" lawyer and the firm (The ABA terms it a close, regular and personal relationship); 3) the relationship must not involve conflicts of interest; and 4) the title must not be otherwise false or misleading.

"Of Counsel" Relationships Properly Understood - Lawyers ...

Raise your hand if you're clear on what "of counsel" really means. To different lawyers it means different things. Typically, the designation "of counsel" means an attorney who is employed by a firm but not as an associate or partner. Often the designee is a former judge or government official transitioning to private practice.
